| 1. Pictish | Lancs | Alchemist | 4.3 | Refreshing, straw-coloured ale with crisp malt flavours and a robust hoppy finish. |
| 2. Acorn | S.Yorks | Barnsley Bitter | 3.8 | A pale brown beer, well balanced, with a dry and bitter finish. |
| 3. Elgoods | S.Cambs | Cambridge Bitter | 3.8 | A mid-brown bitter with a good balance of malt and hop character. The finest pale-ale malt made from Maris Otter Barley is blended with Torrified wheat, invert sugar and a small amount of roast barley Hops used are English Fuggles & Challenger. |
| 4. Shardlow | Leics | Five Bells | 5.0 | Dark red coloured with a fruity aroma. Smooth on the palate. Some dryness and roast malt in the finish. |
| 5. Arundel | West Sussex | Grumpy Granny | 4.3 | Golden bitter with a florally finish. |
| 6. Ventnor | Isle of Wight | Hippy High Ale | 4.4 | Hippy High Ale was brewed especially for the Radio 1 DJ Rob Da Bank's Festival on the Isle of Wight. It is a light hoppy beer to keep everybody hopping to the music. A real up-tempo beer. |
| 7. Thornbridge Hall | Derbyshire | Jaipur | 5.9 | A pleasant honey sweetness that doesn't overpower, but balances out the citrus nicely. The flavours develop and become increasingly bitter, leading to a long, dry and bitter aftertaste. |
| 8. Jarrow | Tyne & Wear | Joblings Swinging Gibbet | 4.1 | Amber best bitter using toffeeish pale malt like Marris Otter, with some pleasant English type earthy/citric hops. |
| 9. Anglo Dutch | W.Yorks | Kletswater | 4.0 | Pale coloured beer, hoppy nose, hop & citrus fruit flavour. Full bodied & smooth. Dutch for waffle water |
| 10. Hadrian & Border | Newcastle | Legion Ale | 4.2 | Well balanced amber coloured beer, full bodied with good malt flavours, well hopped with a long bitter finish |
| 11. Milestone | Notts | Lions Pride | 3.8 | Well-balanced, light and refreshing ale. |
| 12. Okells | Isle of Man | MacLir | 4.4 | Resiny hops and lemon on the aroma. Light coloured, refreshing but strong – with banana and lemon. |
| 13. Buffys | Norfolk | Mild | 4.2 | Somewhat stronger than the mass produced brands, and reflects the current preference for mid strength beers. Maris Otter and Chocolate malts are blended to produce this rich easy drinking ale. |
| 14. Woodfordes | Norfolk | Nelson's Revenge | 4.5 | The flavour develops from the biscuity malt sweetness to a long hop-induced finish. |
| 15. 3 Rivers | Manchester | Oxbow | 4.5 | A robust and powerful hoppy bitter with a prominent aroma and a notable citrus aftertaste. |
| 16. Grainstore | Rutland | Panther Mild | 3.4 | Smooth, well rounded with a balance of hops and malt |
| 17. Blackawton | Cornwall | Peninsula Ale | 4.6 | A best bitter that delivers good malt hit with plenty of bitterness on the finish. |
| 18. Buffys | Norfolk | Peridot | 4.2 | Made with Marris Otter malts. The moderate bitterness come from Styrian Goldings and Mounthood hops |
| 19. RCH | Somerset | PG Steam | 3.9 | This complex multi layered ale has a floral hop aroma with medium bodied hop, bitter taste with some fruit and sweetness. |
| 20. Mauldons | Suffolk | Pickwick | 4.2 | Rich rounded malt flavour with ripe aromas of hops & fruit. Bitter sweet finish |
| 21. Downton | Wiltshire | Polish Golden Ale | 4.0 | Pale golden beer made with 100% Polish hops (Lobelski, Maryuka, Premiant) distinctive bitter ale with a herbal spicy finish |
| 22. O'Hanlons | Devon | Port Stout | 4.8 | Bitter and satisfying, this national and international award winner is in the finest tradition of dry stout, but with a unique softness and mellowing warmth that lingers on the palate. |
| 23. Kelburn | Glasgow | Red Smiddy | 4.1 | Smooth, dry ale with a unique spicy aroma and flavour. Its reddish hue, warm glow and tight head give it a presence that makes it stand out against its competitors. |
| 24. Williams Bros. | Clackmannan-shire | Roisin | 4.2 | Roisin (pronounced Rosheen) uses the Tayberry to give the beer its flavour and pink colour. |
| 25. Surrey Hills | Surrey | Shere Drop | 4.2 | Hopped with a distinctive aroma and taste. Fresh new flavours have been developed using traditional brewing methods |
| 26. Twickenham Brewery | Middlesex | Summer Gold | 4.1 | Golden-coloured beer with a big fresh fruity citrus nose and taste. Refreshing, hoppy finish |
| 27. Westerhams | Kent | Summer Perle | 3.8 | Golden ale, first gold, cascade, hallertaver perle hops, citrisy, zesty hoppy beer with spicy note |
| 28. Harveys | E. Sussex | Sussex Best | 4.0 | It is a full, well-hopped bitter with a reputation that exceeds the borders of its native and adjoining counties. |
| 29. Cairngorm | Aviemore | Tradewinds | 4.3 | Champion Specialty Beer of Britain 2004, 2005 & 2006 |
| 30. Roosters | N.Yorkshire | Yankee | 4.3 | Tasty, light and full of flavour |
